NATIONAL AWARD FOR TAWA COMMUNITY

Tawa Community Board won the "Enhancing Communities" award at the nation-wide community boards' biennial conference in Wanaka this past weekend. The board submitted an entry showcasing "Neighbours' Weekend in Tawa 2012".

Community boards from around the country were invited to submit in advance their entries for the "Community Boards Best Practice Awards" which recognise excellence in the implementation of projects and initiatives in local governance.

A winner is chosen in each of three categories, one of those being "Enhancing Communities".

Around 200 delegates representing New Zealand's 116 community boards

gathered together in Wanaka to share ideas and to listen to a range of inspiring speakers including Sam Johnson, the "earthquake boy" from Christchurch.
