TAWA COMMUNITY GRANTS

The Tawa Community Board has \$15,000 each year to be made available to worthy local causes. The Tawa Community Grants Fund is designed to assist voluntary projects in Tawa.

Grants may be made for charitable, educational, welfare, community development, cultural, recreational, sporting, activity development, equipment or training programmes. Applications close 28 February 2019.

To be eligible, applicants must:

- show that their project benefits residents of Tawa
- not have excess unallocated reserve funds

Preference will be given to projects that will be completed within 12 months.

NEIGHBOURS' DAY IN TAWA COMING SOON!

PICK UP YOUR 200L WATER TANK AT LINDEN

The official recommendion is that we have 140L of water *per person* stored away to tide us over in the event of a major emergency. That equates to 560L for a family of four.

At the very minimum it makes sense for each household to have at least one 200L emergency tank filled with water. If you would like to acquire one locally, please email malcolm.sparrow@wcc.govt.nz – we have a few available in Tawa for \$110 each.

There will be a few water tanks for sale at the Linden Social Centre event on Saturday 16 February. To pre-order and pre-pay for picking one up on the day, please email through your request.

PARKING IMPROVEMENTS IN TAWA

A review of parking in the central shopping area of Tawa was undertaken by WCC officers in the latter half of last year.

Action will be taken shortly to widen a few parking spaces which are currently too small. With narrow spaces, encroachment on the next space (see the pic) often means the adjacent space is rendered useless.

There will be a slight reduction in the overall number of parking spaces on the Main Road between Lincoln Ave and the Cambridge St/Lyndhurst Road roundabout, similarly slightly fewer parking spaces outside the Tawa Community Centre in Cambridge St.



On 16 January WCC advised that "..... the work has been programmed to happen in the next three or four weeks." Watch this space (or those spaces)!

BING LUCAS DRIVE/TAKAPU ROAD INTERSECTION

From WCC: "Council is planning to widen this intersection to assist vehicles turning in and out of Bing Lucas Drive at the Takapu Road intersection.

It is proposed to carry out the physical work in February 2019"

This is an issue which was first brought to Council's attention by the Tawa Community Board several years ago. It's good to see action finally being taken!

Tawa Music Centre Enrolment Day for 2019 is Saturday 16th February at Tawa Intermediate School hall, 9.00am to 10.30am.



OUTER GREEN BELT PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Public consultation is now under way on the Draft Outer Green Belt Management Plan 2019.

On the WCC website: "The Outer Green Belt is a series of reserves on the edge of the city that stretch from the Porirua City boundary to the south coast [of Wellington]. It covers more than 3,000 hectares and comprises over half of the City's public reserves network." This includes Spicer Forest and Te Ngahere-o-Tawa (formerly Forest of Tane) on Tawa's western hills.

VOLUNTEERS WANTED! GIRLS NEED STRONG ROLE MODELS!






NEW BOOK BY TAWA AUTHOR

CONGRATULATIONS TO TAWA SQUASH CLUB

Tawa Squash has notched up yet another award.


