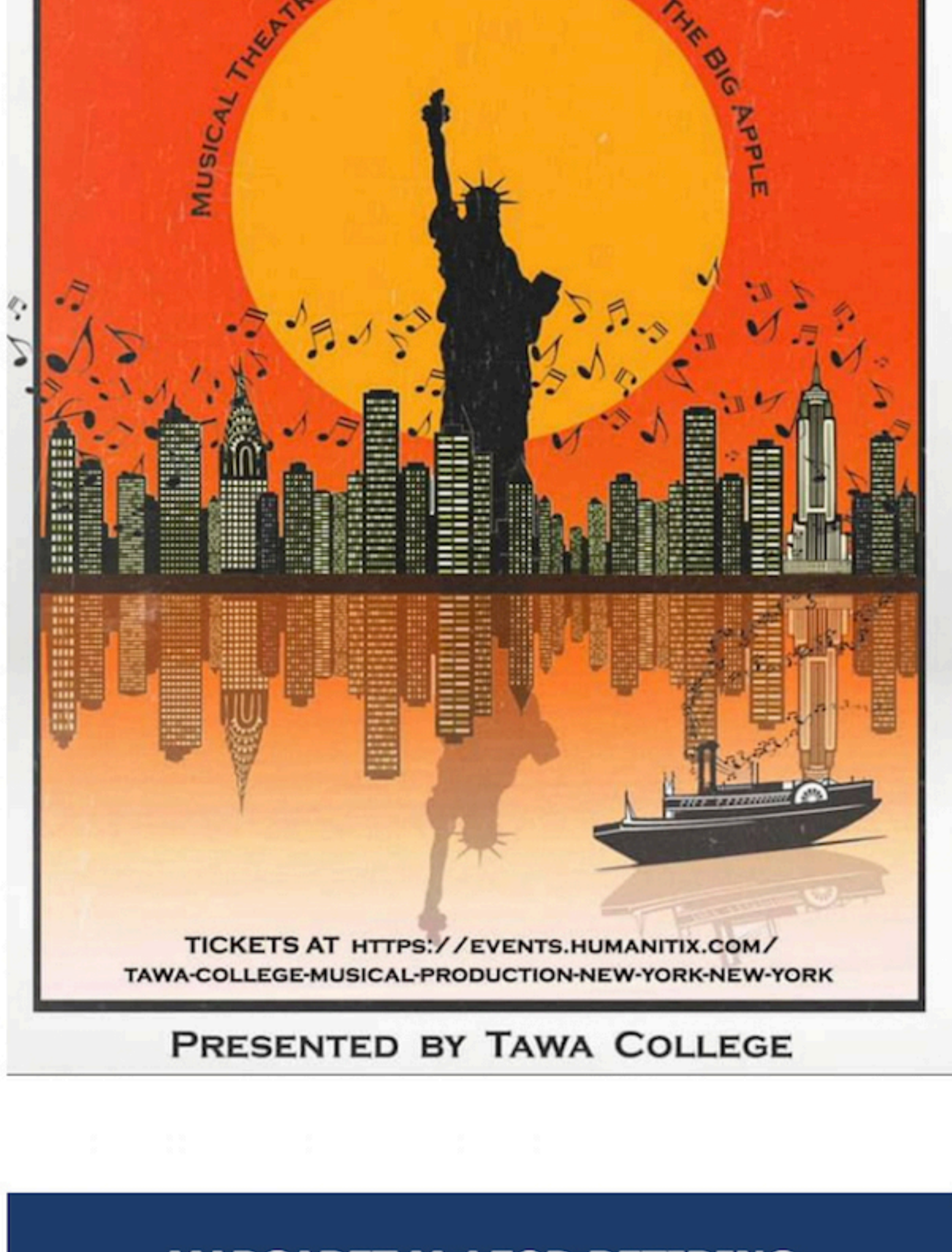
NEW YORK, NEW YORK

All the best and thanks again, Margaret."

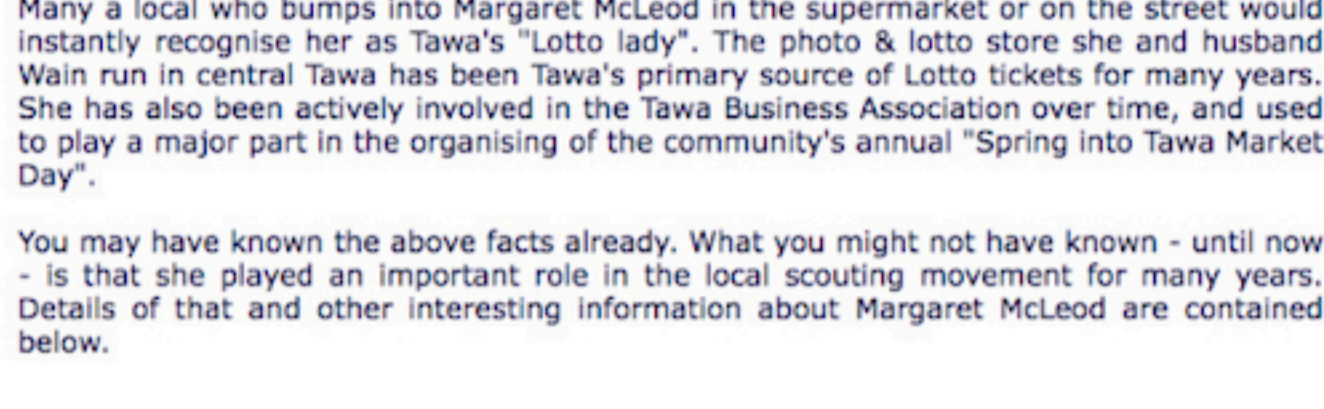
The post was obviously well-received. As at 9pm last night (Monday 26th) it had attracted 595 likes and 151 comments!

Please make your nomination at wellington.govt.nz/rd/tawa or pick up a nomination form from the library or community centre.

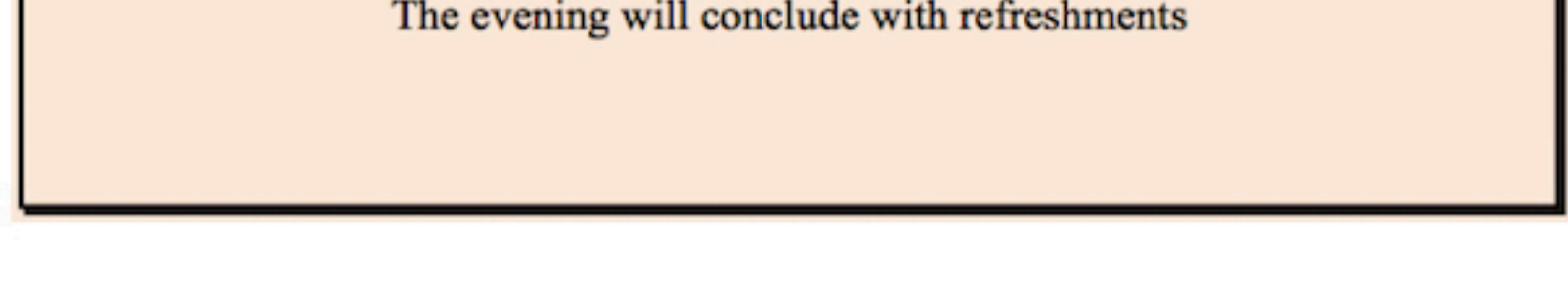
Know a 'Good Sort' in Tawa?
