The Tawa College Board is currently undergoing an Appointment Process for a new Tumuaki/Principal as Mr Murray Lucas is leaving at the end of this year.

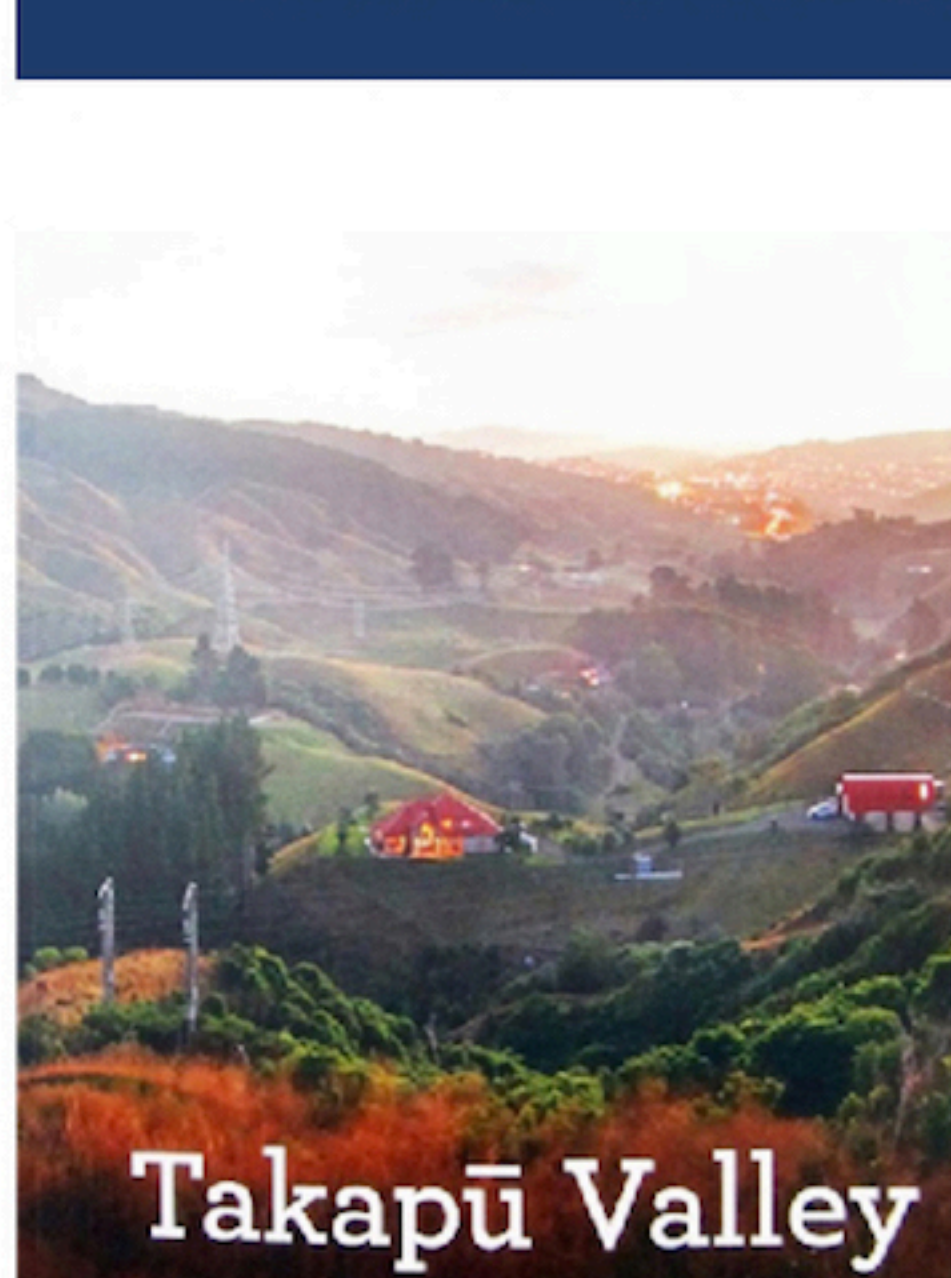
We value your input into determining the kind of leadership the college community would like to see in the future.
