# **TAWA LINDEN PLUNKET NEW BUILDING - WE DID IT!**

Those who drive down Linden Ave regularly will have noticed a big change in the past few months. In early December, Tawa Linden Plunket celebrated a major milestone in its 10 year plus journey to rebuild the Plunket rooms and moved their brand new building on to the site. The building was constructed during 2015 by students at Whitireia Polytechnic and with the amazing support of Bunnings Porirua. Since the building was moved to the site, much work has occurred to prepare the building for use – and it's finally time to open the building to the community. The building is fit for purpose – containing two clinic rooms, a large function space available to hire and our Toy Library, all under the same roof! There are still some finishing touches to make to the building over the coming weeks and months, including some landscaping and construction of a play area for young children on site.

Clinic appointments for young children resumed in the new rooms on Monday 29 February, and other services including B4 School Health Checks, SKIP and PEPE free parenting classes and PINs (Plunket in the Neighbourhood) Coffee Groups are returning to the rooms from this week. There will be an official opening of the building on Sunday 20 March followed by a Community Open Day. Everyone is invited along between 11am - 3pm to tour the new building, enjoy activities such as the bouncy castle, ride on toys, face painting and balloon twisting, to see Big Blue, the Plunket Mascot and enjoy our sausage sizzle and bake sale. The 20th will also mark the re-opening of the Toy Library, now located inside our great new building. Those who join the Toy Library on the day will receive a special deal – two quarters membership for the price of one! The open day is your chance to see our great new community facility in action and have a great day out.

The Plunket Rooms now feature a great function room space available to hire. There are commercial, community and koha hireage rates available. This space is large, open and bright – and perfect for birthday parties, meetings, craft sessions and classes and lots more. # **HAVE YOUR SAY ON THE CONVENTION CENTRE & MOVIE MUSEUM**

Wellington City Council is currently inviting your feedback on its proposal to fund a combined Convention Centre and Movie Museum. The total capital cost to Wellington City will be \$134.4 million, comprising \$65.6m for the Convention Centre and \$68.8m for the Movie Museum.

For every \$1 spent on this project, Council forecasts a \$5.80 return on investment to the city. Councillors are excited by the potential this combined venture has for Wellington and, at this stage, have given unanimous backing to it.

"The combined project can be delivered within Council's Financial Strategy and can be delivered within the rates targets set out in the Long-Term Plan."
