'SCENARIOS' WHICH MAY AFFECT SOUTHWEST TAWA

As it states on the WCC website: "Upper Stebbings Valley is one of the last remaining areas in Wellington identified for new housing. We have developed high level options for how a new community could look, based on feedback from the public and interested parties in August and September 2018. We are inviting public feedback on the options."

Wellington City Council is currently asking for the views of each of us on how Stebbings Valley – over the hill from southwestern Tawa – might have an impact on Tawa. There will be a huge number of houses built on what is currently farmland north of Churton Park. As the nearest business centre and railway station, etc, will be in Tawa, a road over the hill is being proposed and is probably inevitable. That isn't necessarily a bad thing if it is designed well, connects to Tawa where it will have the fewest negative effects, and if the likely ramifications are considered in advance. One of those will be how the new road joins up with either Tawa's Main Road or to Willowbank Road (further south). Another repercussion is likely to be considerably more vehicles wishing to park at Takapu Road Station.

Tawa residents and others have the opportunity to provide their feedback to Council. IT IS IMPORTANT that we do so! The closing date for feedback is Sunday 9 December.

BANK RETENTION WORK ALONGSIDE THE MAIN ROAD (SOUTH)

We asked Council what the story was with the scaffolding currently in place against the hillside on the western side of the Main Road opposite ITM Tawa, near Outlet City.

Council's response:

"The scaffolding is for urgent bank retaining. There were two significant slips happened on the slope on November 2016.

Our geotechnical assessment estimated that the slip occurred in the order of two- to five-year event. A substantial failure is likely to occur again with a major consequence to Main Road (and road users) and was considered as a high risk. The presence of shotcrete adjacent the site suggest that other failures have occurred in this area in the past. As such, it required detailed investigation, design, planning and implementation of treatment options to reduce risk to acceptable levels, hence, these slope stabilisation works."
