LONG GRASS IS SCHEDULED TO BE CUT SHORTLY

Concerns have been expressed locally about the length of the grass in the vicinity of SH1 on and off ramps to Tawa (both the eastern and western side of the motorway). The grass is so long that claims have been made it is blocking visibility. It is the NZ Transport Agency's responsibility to maintain these areas.

After approaching NZTA recently, we have been advised by their contractors, Fulton Hogan: "These areas of the network have been programmed to be cut from 1 December through to 8 December." So there we have it! The grass should be cut next week.





HANGING BASKETS TO BE 'REPLACED' SOON

As you probably already know, the flowers in the hanging baskets in the central Tawa shopping district are replaced every six months or so. The intention is to hang the next lot of baskets before Christmas.

The Tawa Potted Colour Committee is responsible for maintenance of the hanging baskets. It costs \$3000+ each year to keep them in place. Thanks to the Tawa Business Group, the Tawa Community Board and various private and commercial sponsors for their financial assistance.




CHRISTMAS LIGHTS SWITCHED ON

The new bulbs will have a great Christmas feel as they will change from red to green and vice versa every 15 seconds."
