



ARMISTICE DAY SERVICE ON 11 NOVEMBER

The Tawa Historical Society and the RSA will be responsible for a shortish Service of Remembrance at the Tawa Memorial at 10.45am on 11 November 2018 to commemorate the centenary of the conclusion of World War 1, at which a plaque will be unveiled.

GIVE-A-LITTLE PAGE TO FIX RSA SWITCHBOARD

There was a fire in the switchboard at Tawa RSA last week and \$15,000 is required to fix this. As the club does not have the necessary funds in hand, a Give-a-Little page has been set up at https://givealittle.co.nz/cause/save-tawa-rsa#

The wording on that page, dated 20 October, is as follows:

"Last night the switchboard at the Tawa RSA clubrooms shorted and started a fire. They need \$15,000 to fix it and will have not electricity until they do. If they can't get it fixed then they might have to close down. If this happens where will you go for your march on ANZAC day? The RSA is an icon of our village. A central meeting

point for activities, meetings, celebrations, funerals. They do have insurance but apparently it doesn't cover this. In this climate it is hard for RSAs to keep going financially and this is why they don't have the funds to fix it."

"I really enjoy writing and hosting the quiz at The Roundabout" she says, "It's a lot of fun and there is a real sense of community about the evenings".


"My quizzes are all custom-written for the audience. My married surname is Taylor, so they are Taylor-Made!"
