KIWI IN TAWA'S BACKYARD?

The Friends of Tawa Bush Reserves (FOTBR) invite you to hear Capital Kiwi's Paul Ward talk about a plan to make kiwi in Tawa's backyard a reality.

2018 Wellingtonian of the Year finalist Paul Ward grew up roaming the hills behind Johnsonville, where native wildlife was rarely seen. Returning from an OE that took in an Oxford Masters, and working for Discovery Channel, he couldn't believe Wellington was now home



to kākā and tīeke. Like many others he was inspired to help out. He co-founded Polhill Protectors (Supreme Award winner, 2017 Wellington Airport Wellington Community Awards), out of which Capital Kiwi was born.

The Capital Kiwi mission is to return kiwi to the wild in Wellington's backyard. The key goal to enable this is the elimination of stoats from the landscape.

Capital Kiwi is already trapping above Te Ngahere o Tawa – the Forest of Tawa.

PIANO OUTSIDE THE LINDEN SOCIAL CENTRE


The Tawa Community Board commissioned ROX Art NZ to paint this piano. It is now available to play outside the Linden Social Centre.
