BIG SING IN DUNEDIN

The National Big Sing Finale was held in

Dunedin recently. Tawa College's "Blue Notes" received their first gold award which is a tremendous effort and a real tribute to their conductor Isaac Stone.



At the Big Sing Finale choirs can gain gold, silver or bronze awards. Gold is obviously the highest award! There were 24 choirs selected in the National Finale, with more than 800 participants (as in the pic below right), and only five received gold awards. The other four were schools from Auckland. Tawa College was the only co-educational school to receive gold.

Blue Notes also obtained the Big Sing Tour Time Award for the best performance of a classical work.

Justin Lester, the Mayor of Wellington, will be hosting an afternoon tea on October 16th to recognise the choir's excellent performance.



TAWA COLLEGE BASKETBALL SUCCESS

Congratulations to the Tawa College boys basketball team on beating Scots College 96-79 in the final of the Premier 1 Trophy for supremacy in college basketball in Wellington. Tawa won the Pohlen Cup for the first time in 60 years.

Josh Johnson of Tawa College was awarded the trophy for top points scorer in the overall competition. In the Central NZ Zone Tournament, Tawa College was placed fourth and qualified for the National Secondary Schools Basketball tournament.


Daniella and Danielle will combine together as a duo at the National Championships in the Teams' event as well as performing in the Individual competition.

The next Sunday roast at the RSA will be on Sunday 22 September at the RSA complex at the northern end of Oxford St.



2 MINUTES WITH Denise Byarugaba

Denise Byarugaba is the Neighbourhood & Community Advisor at the Linden Social Centre. Considerable attention is currently being given to Linden, particularly north Linden, with community leaders and city council officers liaising with local residents to determine what improvements could be made to enhance the area. Denise is an integral part of that project.

The Kai Kitchen inititiative – free hot meals to all Linden locals, friends and whanau every Friday from 12.30pm at the Linden Social Centre – has been running since June under Denise's leadership. From small beginnings it has grown to cater for dozens of locals who gather to enjoy both the company and the tasty soup, etc each week.



With Denise's enthusiasm and energy at the fore, we can expect a lot more to happen in the "Linden space" in the weeks and months ahead.

Where were you born? I was born in beautiful Uganda, a small country in equatorial Africa.

Where did you grow up? I grew up in the capital of Uganda – Kampala.

Where were you educated?

My early education was in Uganda, but I moved to Zimbabwe to do my University. All my post-graduate study was done in New Zealand.

How long have you lived in Tawa?

I lived in Tawa for over 10 years. I have only recently (3 months ago) moved to Upper Hutt to be near work for my husband.

What do you like about Tawa?

Tawa is such a wonderful suburb, with a great community feel. It is self-contained and has everything you could ever need. There are so many opportunities available for any resident to get involved with a variety of activities irrespective of age or interest.

What about family?

I am very blessed to have a beautiful family – my husband Peter, and my three boys Mikka, Ethan and Caleb, aged 23, 18 and 6 respectively.
