REPORT FROM THE TAWA VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADE

This report was supplied by the local Fire Brigade in mid-March when this newsletter was meant to have been sent out. I take the blame for the fact that it (this report) is not quite up-to-date!

Members of the Tawa Volunteer Fire Brigade attended the following fire calls in the period 1 January to 12 March 2009:

The new Minister of Internal Affairs, Hon Dr Richard Worth, recently visited the Fire Station and was very impressed with the brigade and station. He commented on our new fire appliance and the new gymnasium area. The Brigade has been very fortunate to receive assistance in funding the gymnasium area from the Freemasons. We also have an application to the Tawa Community Grants (Wellington City Council) and New Zealand Community Trust for further assistance in completing the gymnasium project. Dr Worth commented on how pleased he was to see we were helping ourselves as much as possible.

Upcoming projects/events: The Brigade will be part of the Tawa ANZAC Day events, marching to the RSA.

TAKAPU ISLAND UPDATE

The Tawa Community Board has had several discussions with the engineers and the developers of Takapu Island in respect of the road changes proposed for that part of Takapu Road between the rail bridge and the motorway.

The proposal approved by the New Zealand Transport Agency, and funded wholly by the developers of the proposed Takapu Island development, involves:

- installing a roundabout at the intersection formed between Takapu Road and the exit of the motorway from Wellington and the entrance to the motorway to Porirua.
- installing a roundabout at the entrance to the new development.
- reducing the speed limit to 50 km/h between the rail bridge and the motorway onramps.

It is anticipated that the works will:

- · not impact on the Willowbank Reserve
- take until late May 2009
- not adversely affect traffic flow into and out of Tawa
- temporarily route traffic onto the northern side of the entrance to the development while the existing road is built up to the same level as the new road.

The Tawa Community Board, the developers, the engineers and the contractors are all communicating to ensure that Tawa residents and road users are not unduly inconvenienced during the road changes. Hopefully the new layout, which includes better signage, a new storm water system, far improved lighting and a much higher quality of skid resistant asphaltic paving, will produce a higher degree of safety and benefit us all.
