The roading and roundabouts adjoining (on the north side of) "Takapu Island" are now basically finished, and the planting of the roundabouts is currently taking place. PARKING IN LINCOLN AVE

The Tawa Community Board advises that it is working with the Wellington City Council in trying to sort out a solution to residents' concerns about traffic volumes, drop-offs, and parking outside the Big Air facility at the eastern end of Lincoln Ave. Large numbers of children take part in classes there - which is a good thing - but the resultant traffic involved in dropping off and picking up is causing a few headaches for some. We'll keep you informed of developments.

TAWA COMMUNITY BOARD'S ADVOCACY PLAN - YOUR CHANCE TO BE HEARD!

The Tawa Community Board is putting together an "Advocacy Plan", the intention being "... to clarify what actions and outcomes the community wants to see happen in Tawa, and what assistance the community needs from the council or other agencies to achieve these goals." There's more to it than that, but that's the gist of it.

A meeting is being held at the Tawa Community Centre at 7pm on Monday 2 November to give us in the community an opportunity to contribute to this. TAWA-PORIRUA STREAM WALKWAY

As most of you would have read in various local newspapers in the first week of July, the Wellington City Council approved the funding allocation of \$4 million over 10 years for local tracks/cycleways etc throughout the region and expenditure of \$250,000 during the 2009/10 fiscal year. At present Council officers have engaged consultants to review the best method of making a funding application from outside transport funding agencies to assist in covering the cost of the Tawa route.

Council officers have organised a display of the proposed Tawa- Porirua Stream walkway and a write-up in the Tawa Library in the internet computing section. Please visit the library and study the proposed route.
