#### TAKAPU ISLAND ROUNDABOUTS

As previously advised, the NZTA is part-way through a safety audit at the Takapu Island roundabouts. The piece of land at the right as one enters Tawa from the motorway (heading north) has been progressively lowered over the past little while, ensuring that we can see traffic heading towards us from under the 'motorway bridge'. Whether it's been lowered enough has not yet been determined. Regarding Takapu Island itself, no applications for building or resource consent are in the works, meaning that not a lot will be happening there in the foreseeable future.

## TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF REDWOOD STATION

Tranz Metro advises: "We're getting the Redwood platform ready for the arrival of the new 'Matangi' trains in 2010. In order to do this, we will be closing this station from 8 February 2010 for around 4 months." They don't advise how all the cars that usually park at Redwood Station will squeeze into the carparks at Takapu Road Station or Tawa Station. Could be interesting!

### TAWA INTERMEDIATE - THE CHAMPIONS

Just in case you haven't heard, Tawa intermediate Girls' Cricket team are the New Zealand Champions and holders of both the Wellington and Milo Shields. They played Heaton Intermediate (of Christchurch) in the semi-final, winning 127 – 125. In the final (played in Palmerston North), Viscount School (of South Auckland) bowled Tawa out for 108.
