A big **THANK YOU** to each and every one of you who has signed the Tawa Community Board's ePetition for a Turf in Tawa.

If you haven't already signed, we would really appreciate your doing so!

If you have already signed, **PLEASE** get the rest of your family to do so. That action in itself could add several hundred names to the petition.

The vast majority of local people with whom we've been in contact think that the idea of an artificial turf in Tawa will be great for the community as a whole.

A couple of other responses have been:

• "Won't it add to my already high rates bill?" We say no, it won't. If

the WCC has already allowed for funding for a small number of artificial turfs in Wellington, it makes sense for the community of Tawa to raise its collective hand and say, "Please pick us for one of those turfs". That's precisely what we're doing. Better here than 25kms away!

• "I'm not into sport. It doesn't do anything for me." The reality is that the majority of us who have signed the petition won't directly benefit from it. However the community as a whole will. That's what Tawa is all about – community! Working for the common good, that sort of thing (which on the whole we do pretty well – that's what people like about this place!).

And for statistics freaks (like the writer):

At the end of Tuesday of last week, the petition had gained 165 signatures - after 4½ days. As at 8pm today (Friday), the petition had 1092 signatures - after 14½ days. Halfway there!

79.0% of those are from Tawa (brilliant!), 6.4% from Porirua, 5.0% from other northern suburbs of Wellington, and 4.7% from other parts of Wellington city.

It would be great to exceed 2,000 signatures by 11 March. We can do that with at least 65 signatures a day. So please do get the rest of your family (and a few friends) to add their names. Go to http://www.wellington.govt.nz/haveyoursay/e-petitions/ep/details/154.

TAWA COMMUNITY BOARD SNIPPETS

TAWA COMMUNITY PLAN

Tawa Community Board is finalising the draft of a "Community Plan" which sets out the role of the community board in Tawa and some specifics as to what the board wants to achieve in Tawa over the next three years. The plan will shortly be available for local residents to peruse (it's actually reasonably interesting) and to provide feedback.

THE PROPOSED NEW SUPERMARKET

At the very end of November New World will take over Woolworths' supermarket complex. Total refurbishment will take place at that stage, with the new New World supermarket not re-opening until well into 2012. In the meantime a free bus service to New World Porirua is likely to be available and there may well be a temporary "convenience store" in the other part of the mall. The new highly-improved supermarket will be more than one-third larger.

NEW TOILETS AT WILLOWBANK

The public toilets at the entrance to Willowbank will be getting a major revamp in another two or three months' time. The intention is to retain the current concrete pad, keep the structure of the roof as a dual sheltered/viewing area, open up the structure into the reserve and enhance visibility of the stream (improved views?), and install Exeloo pre-built toilets.

PROPOSED RESTORATION OF TAWA RAILWAY STATION

Tawa Community Board is discussing with the Tawa Historical Society the possibility of restoration of the Tawa Railway Station. If you've seen what has been done with Plimmerton Station, you'll appreciate the possibilities with Tawa Station. We'll keep you informed of developments.

TAWA LOOKOUT HISTORICAL WALK

Around 180 hardy souls took part in the Rotaryorganised walk on Sunday afternoon, 20th February 2011, starting at the Tawa Community Centre at 2pm.

Tawa's own Aspire Band provided entertainment at the outset, then it was off in the direction of Oxford St and the first stop at Grasslees Reserve. At this point Bruce Murray (Tawa Historical Society) gave a talk on the significance in the history of Tawa of the Grasslees name and of Elsdon Best, the man. Along Davies St to McLellan St and Ranui Tce, and through the pedestrian walkway under the motorway to the next stop and another talk.



Then Allen Tce, Lupin & Spicer to the cul-de-sac in Woodman Drive. Being a very sunny and rather warm day (superb weather in actual fact), the water spray provided by the local fire brigade in the cul-de-sac was much appreciated. Some distance further along Woodman Drive a left-turn into Kilkelly Close was followed by the final track up to the Rotary lookout where one is rewarded with splendid views of the whole of the Tawa valley.
