SPRING INTO TAWA MARKET DAY ALMOST HERE

Join us at "Spring into Tawa" Market Day on Saturday 14 September. It will take place at the Main Road shopping centre from 9am to 12.30pm, wet or fine, with more than 60 stalls selling everything from cakes and sausages to Asian food, plants, jewellery and various gifts, and handing out information.

Throughout the morning there will be a variety of entertainment including Harriette the Clown tying balloon animals, the Red Hackle Pipe Band and a group of college-age ukelele players. Emergency services including the Fire Brigade and Police will be taking part.

WANNA SEE SOME COOL HOT RODS?

The next Guide Dogs Fun Run will start at New World Tawa on Sunday 15 September. From 1pm to 2.30pm around 80 hot rods and special interest vehicles will assemble to start the mystery run which includes a number of challenges. All funds go to the Royal NZ Foundation for the Blind.

Tony Bouzaid, the coordinator, said it is great to have sponsors like Repco, New World and 15 others get behind this event as the costs of raising Guide Dogs are every high. "We hope people

will come along and have a look and we hope to have several dogs there." Donations can be made to collectors on the day.

Organised by Capital Rodders, this is the ninth year the event has been run, and the second time it has started in Tawa. Last year it raised \$3,050.

IN DEFENCE OF DE FENCE

You may have noticed the chainlink fence that has been constructed on the Main Road side of Grasslees Reserve. That part of the park is an official dog exercise area. Comments have come through from members of the community describing the fence as being "rather unattractive".

Back in April the Council advised the Tawa Community Board: "In response to this feedback and

concerns [more than 40 public submissions requesting that the dog exercise area be fenced off], the Council will install a fence along the Main Road boundary. This will be a 1m high chainlink fence in the middle of shrub planting. This will prevent dogs (and children) from being able to easily access Main Road, and the planting will eventually screen the fence to create a more attractive and unobtrusive appearance."

So with any luck the shrubs and whatever else will grow quickly and obscure the "rather unattractive" fence which is shown here, pre-shrubs.

MEET THE NORTHERN WARD CANDIDATES


Otto von Bismarck is reputed to have said: "People never lie as much as after a hunt, during a war, or before an election."

BIZARRE BAZAAR


