The swearing-in of the new Tawa Community Board will take place at 7pm on Thursday 14 November at the Linden Social Centre, Linden Ave. This is the ninth Tawa Community Board since the board was first











established in 1989. Elected members of the new board are Graeme Hansen, Richard Herbert, Margaret Lucas, Jack Marshall, Alistair Sutton and Robert Tredger (the order in which they appear in the photo above). The new chair has not yet been determined. Northern Ward city councillors Justin Lester (Deputy Mayor) and Malcolm Sparrow are likely to be appointed to the board as well.

NEARING YEAR'S END AT TAWA COLLEGE

Yesterday (Wednesday 6 November) was the last day of school for Tawa College seniors, years 11-13. It's now officially study time with NCEA exams beginning on Monday.

The college's academic prizegiving took place this past Monday evening with city councillors Malcolm Sparrow and Deputy Mayor Justin Lester, as well as Kris Faafoi, MP for Mana, presenting certificates and various trophies to around 100 students in acknowledgement of academic achievements throughout the course of this year. Congratulations to all of them!

The names of head prefects for 2014 were announced on the night. They are Louren Marley and Jessica Ah Chong (head girl and deputy), Nathanael Roach and Jonty Boyd (head boy and deputy).

Former Tawa College principal, Bruce Murray, and the former chair of the Tawa Community Board, Malcolm Sparrow, presented the Murray Trophy and the Tawa

ANOTHER TAWA FINALIST IN WELLY AWARDS 2013

There are three finalists in the Education Sector of the 2013 Wellingtonian of the Year Award, affectionately known as the Welly Awards. On this occasion two of those three are Tawa people, both with strong Tawa College connections from days gone by.

We mentioned Liz Langham in the last newsletter. It's since come to our attention that she was deputy head girl at Tawa College in 1996.

The other finalist is one of Tawa's most well-known and admired celebrities, Shona Murray. The brief summary on the Welly Finalists website states: "Shona has retired as the organiser of the Tawa Schools and Community music festivals, which began in 1979. They now involve over 700 people and have helped make the suburb a strong musical centre."

Shona won the Arts & Culture category at an earlier Tawa Community Civic Awards ceremony. The script read: "These festivals have brought the community together and established Tawa as a strong centre of music in Wellington. The participation of the primary schools and the Intermediate has encouraged children's interest in music throughout their schooling, and goes a long way to explain why the choirs are so



big and popular at Tawa College. Shona puts in many hours of voluntary time in the selection of a festival theme, choice of music, rehearsal practices for 600 to 700 schoolchildren during the week and the adult choir on Sunday afternoons, and the performances themselves. She is a taonga of Tawa College and the Tawa community." As previously stated, she has now retired from that role.

In the New Year's Honours List 2013 Shona was honoured with a QSM (Queen's Service Medal) for services to music and education. The photo shows Shona with the Governor General at the presentation ceremony.

AFS PASIFIKA LOOKING FOR HOST FAMILIES




